A mouse is looking for a house.

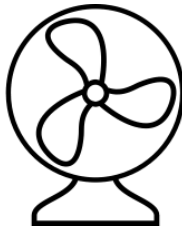
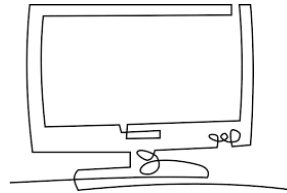


A cup is too small.

TV is too noisy

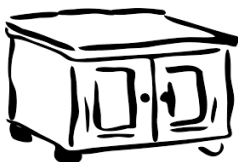


A fan is too cold.
